Architectural Styles:

- Rural Mediterranean
- Tuscan
- Spanish Monterey

General Description:

- The style and pattern is characterized by traditional wrought iron found on historic European and Mediterranean architecture.
- Small-scale scrolls, knuckles, baubles, vertical pickets, and twisted pickets are common.
- Scrolls are generally on less than 20% of the door.
- Simple gridded patterns are also common.
- Lower level kick plates are common.
- The patterns are organized, symmetrical, and balanced.

Notes:

- Door or gate shall be a dark color that compliments the trim colors of the house.
- Screen fabric or metal mesh shall be black, dark bronze, dark brown or dark charcoal color. (no light, cream, or tan colors)
- Doors and gates must be submitted for review and approval by the Design Review Committee prior to installation.



Even if illustrated here, the door must be approved by the DRC prior to installation.
